MEMORANDUM TO CABINET

PROPOSED OVERSEAS TRAVEL: PRIME MINISTER

Proposal

I seek the approval of Cabinet for my absence from New Zealand from the afternoon of Monday 24 February to the evening of Friday 28 February to undertake official travel to Fiji and Australia.

Background

- 2. The key objectives of my visit to Fiji are to:
- cement the bilateral relationship with Fiji and the notion of New Zealand and Fiji as natural strategic partners;
- recognise Fiji as a key regional partner which is taking increasing responsibility for Pacific issues, and which amplifies the Pacific voice in the world;
- underscore to the Government of Fiji the importance of institutionalising and protecting democratic principles and human rights; and
- attend public events which showcase New Zealand's development partnerships with Fiji –
 including in areas of women's empowerment and climate change.
- 3. The main focus of my visit to Australia will be the annual Australia- NZ Leaders' meeting with my counterpart Hon Scott Morrison. Key objectives will be to:
- Reinforce the depth and breadth of the Australia-New Zealand relationship, including during the series of recent emergencies that have had fundamental trans-Tasman dimensions;
- Pursue New Zealand's case for change to Australian policy settings concerning New Zealanders in Australia s6(a)
- Continue to drive forward the Single Economic Market Agenda and the economic benefits it brings to both countries; and

• Share perspectives on challenges in the Pacific and beyond at a time of heightened strategic competition and stark challenges to global rules and institutions.

I will also attend the signing of the Australia and Aotearoa – New Zealand Indigenous Collaboration Arrangement by the Minister for Maori Development and her Australian counterpart.

4. A media contingent from New Zealand will travel with me.

Prime Ministerial Party

5. I will be accompanied by my Chief of Staff, my Chief Press Secretary, officials from DPMC and MFAT, and Police Protection Service officers.

My partner will also accompany me to participate in key parts of the programme.

6. The cost of the travel is estimated to be:

- 7. The above costs will be a charge to Vote: Internal Affairs (Members of the Executive Travel). The costs for the DPMC and MFAT officials, and the Police Protection Service officers, will be a charge to their respective votes. (Approval for any costs associated with Hon Mahuta's travel has been sought separately).
- 8. Some costs associated with accommodation, meals and transport will be met by the host governments.
- 9. The party will travel to and from Fiji and Australia by RNZAF aircraft. (Travel within Fiji will be by commercial aircraft).

10. This paper will be proactively released, subject to any redactions.

Acting Ministers

11. In my absence, I propose that Rt Hon Winston Peters will act as Prime Minister and Minister for National Security and Intelligence on 24 February; Hon Kelvin Davis will act as Prime Minister from 25 to 28 February; Hon Grant Robertson will act as Minister for National Security and Intelligence from 25 to 28 February; and Hon Carmel Sepuloni will act as Minister for Arts, Culture and Heritage and Minister for Child Poverty Reduction for the entire period.

Recommendations

12. I recommend that Cabinet:

- approve my absence from New Zealand from the afternoon of Monday 24
 February to the evening of Friday 28 February to undertake official travel to Fiji and Australia;
- b. <u>agree</u> that I will be accompanied by my Chief of Staff, my Chief Press Secretary, officials from DPMC and MFAT, and Police Protection Service officers;
- c. <u>note</u> that I will be accompanied by my partner who will participate in key parts of the programme;
- d. <u>approve</u> the estimated expenditure of $s^{9(2)(f)(iv)}$ for the Prime Ministerial party as a charge to Vote: Internal Affairs (Members of the Executive Travel);
- e. <u>note</u> that the costs for the DPMC and MFAT officials, and the Police Protection Service officers, will be a charge to their respective votes;
- f. <u>note</u> that the host governments will assist with some accommodation, meal and transport costs;
- g. <u>note</u> that traveL will be by RNZAF aircraft (and commercial within Fiji);
- h. note that a media contingent from NZ will travel with me;
- i. <u>agree</u> that Rt Hon Winston Peters will act as Prime Minister and Minister for National Security and Intelligence on 24 February; Hon Kelvin Davis will act as Prime Minister from 25 to 28 February; Hon Grant Robertson will act as Minister for National Security and Intelligence from 25 to 28 February; and Hon Carmel Sepuloni will act as Minister for Arts, Culture and Heritage and Minister for Child Poverty Reduction for the entire period.
- i. note that this travel will not require me to be absent from a Monday meeting of Cabinet.

Proposed Overseas Travel: Prime Minister

Portfolio Prime Minister

- 2 agreed that she be accompanied by two staff members:
- noted that she will also be accompanied by her partner, who will participate in key parts of 3 the programme;

- 5 noted that she will also be accompanied by:

- 6 **noted** that travel to and from Fiji and Australia will be by RNZAF aircraft;

 - 8.2 Hon Kelvin Davis act as Prime Minister from 25 to 28 February 2020;
 - 8.3 Hon Grant Robertson act as Minister for National Security and Intelligence from 25 to 28 February 2020;
 - 8.4 Hon Carmel Sepuloni act as Minister for Arts, Culture and Heritage and Minister for Child Poverty Reduction;
