Official Information Act request:	Ron Brierley's knighthood	

Thank you for your Official Information Act request received on 19 April 2022. You requested:

"Can you please confirm if Ron Brierley's knighthood has been removed or not. Thank you."

I can confirm that Mr Brierley's appointment as a Knight Bachelor has been cancelled and annulled.

In May 2021, Mr Brierley resigned as a Knight Bachelor, following his conviction on charges relating to possession of child sex abuse material. The resignation followed the Prime Minister's initiating the process to remove his knighthood. 
The Queen accepted the resignation and cancelled and annulled his appointment. The relevant Gazette notice is available at https://gazette.govt.nz/notice/id/2021-vr1895

As a result, Mr Brierley is no longer entitled to use the title "Sir".
