COVID-19: Auckland Community Cases: Physical Distancing on Flights at Alert Level 4

Portfolio COVID-19 Response

On 17 August 2021, following advice that a community case of COVID-19 had been identified in Auckland, Cabinet authorised a group of Ministers comprising the Prime Minister, Deputy Prime Minister, Minister for COVID-19 Response and Associate Minister of Health (Hon Dr Ayesha Verrall) to have Power to Act to take decisions on Alert Level 4 timings and settings [CAB-21-MIN-0324].

Following discussions on 18 August 2021 with officials and Ministers, the group of Ministers with Power to Act:

- noted that Ministers have agreed that, to enable people to return home as soon as possible, physical distancing was not expected on domestic passenger flights at Alert Level 4 for the first 48 hours;
- agreed that physical distancing was expected for all domestic passenger flights following the initial 48 hour period;
- agreed that wearing an appropriate face covering continue to be required on all domestic passenger flights throughout the period of the flight;
- **agreed** that the requirements for the physical distancing on flights be reviewed when New Zealand moves to Alert Level 3 or 2.
