2. Ministry of Health Weekly Report

2.1 Items to Note/Updates

2.1.1 COVID-19 Vaccine and Immunisation Programme

Phase 1 vaccine roll-out

As at 17 March 2021, 26,646 people received their first dose of the vaccine and 515 people have received their second dose. Of those vaccinated, eleven percent are Māori, ten percent are Pacific, and 20 percent are Asian. Vaccinations took place over a total of 56 sites across Northern, Midland, Central and Southern district health boards (DHBs) since the start of the vaccine and immunisation programme.

There was continued effort in the week commencing 15 March 2021 to increase vaccination capacity in South Auckland to vaccinate border workers, their household contacts, and healthcare workers more quickly. Two additional large-scale vaccination centres will open in West and Central Auckland in the coming weeks.

COVID-19 vaccination and immunisation programme team

There was continued engagement with District Health Boards (DHBs) in the week commencing 15 March 2021 on the service delivery models that are required to support Phase 2 of the immunisation programme, including primary care settings and new community vaccination centres.

Technology

The second release of the COVID-19 Immunisation Register (CIR) went live on 9 March 2021, enabling general practitioner notifications, features to support planning for distribution, and additional fields for medical events. Future iterations of the CIR will include more customer facing features, so that people can access their personal information and vaccination status.

Work continues on ensuring that the national booking system and other supporting technology is ready for the Phase 2 rollout.

Provision of vaccines to Polynesia

Individual country planning is underway and a paper on the provision of COVID-19 vaccines to Polynesia is being prepared for April 2021. The paper will provide an update on country readiness for vaccine rollout, identify areas for further support from New Zealand, and seek direction on how the New Zealand Defence Force can support the rollout.

Dose sharing and donations

Officials are working with vaccine suppliers on an approach to donations to the Pacific and are also continuing discussions with Gavi on the possibility of donating doses to COVAX.

2.2 Technical Advisory Group: Update

COVID-19 Vaccine Technical Advisory Group Meeting

The COVID-19 Vaccine Technical Advisory Group (CVTAG) met on 9 March 2021 and agreed to amend its advice on immune checkpoint inhibitors to note that the previous advice of a precaution for patients on these medicines can now be removed.

CVTAG's advice was sought for an out of schedule topic on 12 March 2021. CVTAG provided advice on a briefing that went to the COVID-19 Vaccine and Immunisation Steering Group on 16 March 2021, in relation to the definitions of people with hypertension and obesity within the sequencing framework.

Technical Advisory Group Meeting

The Technical Advisory Group (TAG) did not meet in the last week. As a result, there are no recommendations or advice to report on this week. TAG is next scheduled to meet on 19 March 2021.

3. Managed Isolation and Quarantine Weekly Report



MINISTRY OF BUSINESS, INNOVATION & EMPLOYMENT

3.1 Top Items to Note

3.1.1 Vaccinations update

- MIQ RIQ Leads continue to work closely with DHBs on logistics as the rollout progresses to ensure our workforce are receiving booking invites and are available to attend.
- We received excellent feedback from MIQ workers regarding the additional webinars that have been arranged and supported by health experts to encourage uptake. The first of these has been recorded and has been made available to employers across the border sector.
- System and process limitations are still preventing a large number of vaccination records being linked to an employer, so it is challenging to understand where uptake is low across the system

 we are working with the Ministry of Health to get the records linked so we are able to identify our workforce uptake.
- The second round of doses commenced this week for MIQ workers. The vaccination of workforce close contacts has commenced as well. Ministry of Health has the lead.
- MBIE Employment Relations will undertake a consultation process with senior union leads on the proposed approach with staff who are unable, or choose not, to be vaccinated MBIE MIQ will share the approach with Private Sector Partners for feedback.
- The pack for employers to provide guidance on managing their relations with staff is under final review, with release planned for later this week.

3.1.2 Capacity update

Pullman update

- The Pullman was partially populated (96 returnees in 75 rooms) this week and will remain at no more than 50% capacity until the remedial work is complete.
- There are no issues to report.
- The ventilation remedial plan is on track. The plan has a completion date of 6 to 8 weeks.
- We are managing the loss in capacity between our operational and contingency stock.
- Further reporting on the Pullman will be provided by exception.

Scheduled facility maintenance will reduce MIQ operational capacity over the next six months

- Twelve properties, which we use as managed isolation and quarantine facilities (7 in Auckland, 2 in Hamilton, 1 in Rotorua and 2 in Christchurch), have been in continuous use for periods between six to eleven months and are now due or overdue for routine building maintenance and compliance checks. Over the next six months, as part of a rolling maintenance schedule, these facilities will each be taken offline for a period (either partially or fully) to enable the property owner or management group to carry out needed repairs, including building warrant of fitness work.
- The maintenance programme will begin in Apr 2021 and conclude by late Sep 2021. While it is being implemented a small reduction in MIQ operational capacity will result. The actual reduction will vary depending on the size of the facilities being taken offline at any point in time, but on average the reduction will equate to approximately 217 fewer rooms per fortnight to allocate.



- Scheduled maintenance considerations have already been factored into the most recent MIAS voucher releases for Apr, May, Jun and Jul 2021. Over the next 6 months, the average total number of rooms available in MIAS will reduce to 4,280 per cycle.
- The scheduled maintenance plan includes two quarantine facilities, Jet Park Auckland Airport and the Sudima, Christchurch. To minimise the impact on our quarantine capacity, Jet Park will only be taken off-line one accommodation block at a time, while in Christchurch a contingency plan for the Sudima outage will be developed, using other facilities which have a dual purpose.
- The maintenance programme does not take into account any work that might need to be undertaken as a result of the current Ventilation Review and where possible this work will be conducted concurrently. Following the outcome of the review more facilities may need to be added to the schedule at a later date. A maintenance programme for the period Sept 21 – Mar 22 will also need to be developed in due course.

3.1.3 Voucher release

- During the period 5-15 Mar 2021, 17,170 vouchers were released in MIAS for the period of Apr 2021 through to end Jul 2021.
- A total of 37,000 returnees booked 20,000 rooms to travel for this period. Room ratio is 1.84 returnees per room.
- Returnees from over 170 countries successfully secured a voucher to travel during this period.
- Further top-ups for Jun and Jul 2021 are underway.

3.1.4 Worksafe Engagement

- Deputy Secretary MIQ, Megan Main, and GM Service Quality and Assurance, Shayne Gray, recently met with the CE Worksafe, Phil Parkes, to discuss general matters related to MIQ worker safety.
- It was a positive meeting with an agreement to continue to meet on a regular basis.

3.1.5 Auckland International Airport

- In preparation for potential quarantine free travel, Auckland International Airport have been trialling an inbound passenger/baggage processing system utilising relocated facility infrastructure and an off-site remote baggage facility (RBF).
- Numerous trials have been conducted thus far. MBIE and MoH have raised concerns around dwell times in buses and processing passenger baggage.
- Process development is on-going across agencies (i.e. Customs, MPI, MBIE) to reduce the extended processing time down to a mutually acceptable level.
- Further discussions with all agencies involved will be held on Friday and next week.

3.2 Policy Update

Legislative Authority for Information Sharing (Legally privileged)

MBIE MIQ and MBIE Immigration New Zealand (INZ) are working with Customs to develop a proposal to include legislative provision for information sharing across select COVID-19 agencies in the COVID-19 Public Health Response Act 2020, to provide a more sound legal footing for sharing information for the purposes of administering the COVID-19 border control and managed isolation systems, and for administering the MIQ charging regime. In developing the advice we are engaging closely with the

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Crown Law Office, other agencies, particularly the Ministry of Health and the Ministry of Justice, and the Office of the Privacy Commissioner.



We are continuing to work with Crown Law, the Ministry of Justice, the Chief Government Privacy Officer and the Privacy Commissioner to clarify the extent of these legal risks and alternatives to resolving them, and will incorporate the outcome of these discussions into your upcoming briefing.

RSE workers

The last group of RSE workers will exit MIQ on 20 Mar 2021. No positive COVID-19 test results received. A total of 2,011 of 2,000 projected RSE workers have entered New Zealand for this project. RSE workers by country of origin: 1,166 from Vanuatu, 775 from Samoa, and 70 from Fiji. The total MIQ places utilised to facilitate entry of 2,011 workers equated to 2,025 MIAS vouchers. This total includes rooms unable to be re-allocated due to cancellation/no-show travellers on the day. Death of an RSE worker, understood not to be COVID-19 related, is under coronial investigation.

Refugees

Cohort 1A departed from MIQ this week. No positive COVID-19 test results received. They were reported as being extremely grateful to be in New Zealand. Experiences from Cohort 1A used to inform operations and interpreter support required for subsequent cohorts.

Tokyo 2020 Summer Olympic and Paralympic Games

Packages of necessary pre-Games qualification and competition, and overall post-Games delegation returns requiring MIQ places were submitted by Sport New Zealand into the border exemption Senior Officials and Ministerial group process on 8 Mar 2021. Refined at the request of the Minister for Sport and Recreation, the travel results in an expected delegation of 500-600 returning from the Olympics in August, and of 100 from the Paralympics in September. Options are also being explored to develop a phased approach to delegations returns from Japan, including potentially holding athletes in Japan after the Games to support this.

While packages have been submitted, COVID-19 continues to have a significant impact on pre-Games travel, lowering expected MIQ demand. As an example of this, of the 41 athletes needing to enter MIQ in March and April approved for urgent group allocation (Briefing 2021-2573 refers), 19 were ultimately submitted for allocation due to several event cancellations by international sporting federations (in addition some athletes secured places through the latest public release of MIAS vouchers).



6. New Zealand Customs Service Weekly Report
