# COVID-19 System response to recommendations from the review report into the February 2021 Auckland Outbreak

The COVID19 Continuous Review, Improvement and Advice Group completed a review into the February 2021 Auckland outbreak, there were areas for improvements identified through the recommendations. The Minister for COVID19 has prioritised three workstreams, Contact tracing; Capacity for a large outbreak; and, Coordinated System-wide scenario planning in which there is a requirement to publicly report on progress. The below is the agreed work plan which address these priorities.

## Improvement opportunities

#### Work Programme: work underway

## **Contact Tracing**

The new contact definitions should be removed. Individuals should simply be aware of whether they are a close or a casual contact and what, for the particular outbreak, they need to do, as defined in the outbreak plan.

Ministry of Health: Contact categories will no longer be used in communications to the public in an outbreak.

Minister Verrall will seek further advice on how risk assessments of locations of interest are carried out using the current contact category framework.

## Improvement opportunities

The COVID-19 Response System capacity necessary to contain a large outbreak should be clarified and agreed, then established properly, including with adequate resource and staffing.

> Strategies for addressing tiredness and burnout, while injecting freshness and ongoing self-reflection and self-criticism should be evident and implemented at all levels.

### Work Programme: work underway

Ministry of Health: increases in wider health workforce staffing underway.

Te Kawa Mataaho Public Service Commission: Working with core COVID-19 Chief Executives to build resilience across the system and ongoing support and sustainability of the public service response.

COVID-19 Chief Executives: establishing rosters for response activities.

## Improvement opportunities

Recommendations from various reviews should be collated and reported on regularly to support continuous improvement by ensuring recommendations are actioned or otherwise addressed.

## Work Programme: work underway

Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet: Leading the work on the stocktake of review recommendations and ongoing reporting. Progress against review recommendations will be reported to the Minister for COVID-19 Response on a monthly basis (first report due at the end of June).

## Improvement opportunities

A rolling schedule of scenario planning should now be coordinated by specialists in the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet, with a continuous stress testing regime.

Improvements should be made to the COVID-19 response system as necessary.

#### Work Programme: work underway

Overview of the draft workplan for scenario planning for the remainder of 2021 is below. DPMC will facilitate a series of planning workshops, focussing primarily on New Zealand's domestic preparedness for a potential COVID-19 response, and also contributing where possible to preparations for any Cook Isalnds COVID-19 response, and assisting in QFT response arrangements as required. Completed workshop

Key considerations to work through:

- High density events
- Spread of outbreak local, regional, national
- High density living complex
- Outbreaks at community event (i.e. church, public holiday)

Coordinating agency Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet
