Agency updates on the RCOI Response Work Programme

1. New Zealand Police launch the new firearms registry

The New Zealand Police launched the new firearms registry on 24 June 2023. The new registry will help to create a comprehensive picture of all lawfully held firearms and arms items in New Zealand linked to each individual firearms licence holder and will give Police a tool to disrupt the diversion of firearms. In addition, Police advises that the registry will in turn make it harder for gangs and criminals to acquire guns. The registry has been through multiple security assessments by Government approved independent security experts, and the privacy protections of licence holders' information is in line with government communication security standards. 2. United Nations Statement on Multistakeholder Engagement in Countering Terrorism

The New Zealand Ambassador for Counter Terrorism delivered a statement to the United Nations on multistakeholder engagement in countering terrorism while ensuring compliance with human rights and the rule of law. In this statement, the ambassador referenced the terrorist attack on 15 March 2019 and the subsequent Royal Commission of Inquiry report and recommendations. The ambassador noted the importance of diverse voices in New Zealand's counter terrorism response, and acknowledged the work the Government has made to date on ensuring this and other recommendations are upheld. 3. Public consultation on the sixth session of the United Nations Cybercrime Convention

The sixth session of the United Nations Ad Hoc Committee to Elaborate a Comprehensive International Convention on Countering the Use of Information and Communications Technologies will take place from 21 August – 1 September 2023. Ahead of this session, the Chair has drafted text for the convention, and has requested your views. - **3 July** Asalha Puja (Dhamma Day) The day when Buddha chose his first disciple Kondanna. The day commemorates the first sermon delivered by Buddha after his enlightenment to the five ascetics at a forest near Caranasi.
- **14 July –** Matariki The celebration of the first rising of the Matariki star cluster.
- **14 July –** International Non-Binary People's Day.
