### **Immigration New Zealand**

98% of Recovery Visas have been decided. On average, INZ processes Recovery Visa
applications in 6 weekdays, with approved applications taking an average of 5 weekdays.
Since the previous report (26 June) a further 47 applicants have arrived into New Zealand,
and an additional 57 applications received.

### **Temporary Accommodation Service**

- To date, TAS has deployed 23 relocatable cabins. 12 in Wairoa, 5 in Porangahau, 4 in Waiohiki and 1 each in Waipawa and Westport. Another 4 are expected to be deployed over the coming weeks.
- A joint venture with Omahu Marae in Hastings to supply 11 relocatable homes on Marae whenua using local building firm K3 to build them, has been signed off. TAS is looking at several other opportunities across the region to support local solutions to assist displaced people.
- TAS has recently placed a Request for Proposal (RFP), to lease more relocatable cabins. The RFP closed on 6<sup>th</sup> July. TAS is currently assessing the responses with a view to being able to lease and deploy a significant number of relocatable cabins over the coming months.




### North Island Weather Events Primary Producer Finance Scheme.

- This reporting period, the North Island Weather Events Primary Producer Finance Scheme was announced. This is a new package of financial support for businesses, orchards, and farms affected by the North Island weather events in early 2023. The scheme enables the Government, through Kānoa, to provide concessionary loans and equity finance to help severely affected businesses get back to a point where they can re-engage with commercial lenders. Applications open at the end of July.
