

#### **Labour Market and Companies Office analysis**

Recent analysis found that filled job numbers for May are still higher for all
affected regions than before the severe weather events. Filled jobs continue
to grow over the month for Tāmaki Makaurau and Tairāwhiti, while
Taitokerau and Hawke's Bay experienced a typical seasonal fall. This,
combined with minimal changes in existing trends from Companies Office
data, indicate that intervention measures taken by organisations, Iwi and
Government has contributed to the easing of impacts to businesses.


#### **Immigration New Zealand**

 Demand for the Recovery Visa continues to ease with on average 26 applications received per week in the past month. This indicates there will continue to be lower volumes of offshore workers entering the regions to supplement existing workforce gaps.
