Weekly update on Cyclone Gabrielle recovery activity

Overall approach

Phase 1: Emergency response

Open temporary emergency access and lifelines to affected and isolated communities. Some customer access is likely to be restricted, for example, freiaht.

Phase 2: Providing access for communities

Once lifeline connections are established, start to lift the level of service, to support community access. This includes assessment, stabilisation, minor works and some maintenance.

Phase 3: Rebuild and betterment for the long term

Undertaking permanent rebuild alongside our partners.

Northland SH1 Brynderwyns

- The physical delivery contract has been awarded
- Repair options have been scoped; however, the final option will depend on funding.
- Work has commenced on State Highway 12

SH1 Dome Valley

- The physical delivery contract has been awarded.
- Repair work has commenced.
- A delivery programme is currently being jointly agreed and developed.

SH1 Mangamuka Gorge

- Work continues on site
- A site visit with media and hapu took place on Tuesday 8 August.
- Interactions with partners and stakeholders were positive

Coromandel SH25A Kōpū to Hikuai

- Remains closed to all vehicles until further notice.
- Final clearance of the remaining stockpiled slip materials from the western (Kopū) side was completed on Friday 11 August.
- Clearance of the remaining carriageway slips on the eastern (Hikuai) side continued throughout the week ending Sunday 13 August.

SH25A Taparahi bridge

- A site visit with Ministers and key stakeholders is taking place tomorrow, Friday 18 August.
- Piling has commenced and works are still on programme despite recent weather.
- The bridge will be open in March 2024.

SH25 Ruamahunga Bay Overslips

- GSI have supplied the initial design.
- Final details to be closed out this week.

SH25 Tararu Rockfill Embankment

 Works are ongoing at this site and are expected to be completed by the end of August 2023

Key updates

- Physical works are nearing completion for the bridge abutment washout on SH50. This section of road will open on Friday 25 August.
- Asphalt Concrete (AC) Programme on SH2 Gisborne to Matawai is up and running with works being carried out at night.

East Coast

SH35:

 Remains open with works being carried out on multiple sites under TTM. **SH2 Asphalt Concrete Programme:**

The AC programme is up and running with works being carried out at night.

SH2 Foamed Bitumen Stabilisation pavement work

- Foamed bitumen stabilisation pavement work is nearly 50% complete. Due to the wet weather, the programme will be paused until September.
- The remaining incomplete sites will have a focus on drainage while they dry out in preparation for completing the work.

SH2 North between Te Karaka and Matawai

• Due to multiple dropouts, this section of road is operating under temporary traffic lights until further notice.

Hawke's Bay

SH50 Tikokino to Ongaonga:

- The road is closed while physical works are undertaken for the washed out bridge abutment at the Waipawa River.
- The road will be opened on Friday 25 August.

SH5:

- Emergency works along SH5 continue to progress.
- The Esk Forest underslip has been backfilled to road level. The road is expected to be opened at the end of August.

SH2 Devils Elbow

- Devil's Elbow has been widened, however it is still operating at one lane due to other slips on the road.
- We intend to provide two lane access in the future, however recovery works are yet to be started.

SH2 White Pine Bush

- There will be night time closures on both Sunday 27 and Monday 28 August between 8pm and 4am to urgently install a temporary culvert across the road and dig out a large portion of the overslip material.
- The closure point will be at each end of the Tongoio Settlement Road. A detour route will be available for light vehicles only.
