Official Information Act request about to UFO or UFP events since 1901

Thank you for your Official Information Act 1982 (OIA) request of 13 December 2022.

You have requested:

"I hereby request, under the provisions of the Official Information Act (1982), to be provided with any information that is held, or has been held in the past, by your organisation relating to UFO (unidentified flying objects) or UFP (unidentified flying phenomena) events in New Zealand since 01/01/1901 up to and including today. I am requesting all types of information regarding these events that have been collected by your department over this period"

Please find enclosed copies of documents within scope of your request.

Some information has been withheld under section 9(2)(a) of the Act, to protect the privacy of individuals. In making my decision, I have taken the public interest considerations in section 9(1) of the Act into account.

Further, the New Zealand Defence Force has advised that relevant information (dating from 1952 - 2009) on this subject were made available to the following public libraries: Dunedin Public Library; Hamilton Public Library; the Marlborough District Libraries; the Alexander Turnbull Library; and Infofind (the Radio New Zealand library). These can all be accessed through the interloan capability via the National Library as well.

You have the right to ask the Ombudsman to investigate and review my decision under section 28(3) of the Act.

This response may be published on the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet's website during our regular publication cycle. Typically, information is released monthly, or as otherwise determined. Your personal information including name and contact details will be removed for publication.

Dear Sirs,

We are replying to your letter of 20 March requesting information on our files about any "extra-terrestrial spacecraft and/or occupants that have landed or have been sighted in New Zealand territory". We have not systematically collected information about reported sightings of spacecraft or their occupants supposedly originating from places other than Barth and thus do not have much information on this subject.

2. The External Intelligence Bureau, has played a coordinating role in studying space objects that have either landed in New Zealand or (in the case of artificial satellites) that could conceivably deorbit over this country. In the former category, which most closely matches your requirements, there have been two instances in which we have been involved. On 3 April 1972 debris from what was concluded to be a Soviet satellite fell to Earth and was later recovered from a number of places in South Canterbury. Its re-entry was seen by many people and was well publicised. A report on this incident is enclosed together with a press release. In October 1978 two objects which at first appeared to have been space debris were recovered from the same area, but this was subsequently found to be a hoax.

3. On 23 December 1974, the Union Steam Ship Company sent us a report of a sighting the previous day from the "Rangatira". A copy of this report is also enclosed. We suggest that if you wish to make use of it in any programme of your own that it would be courteous first to request permission of the Union Steam Ship Company.

4. We hold a report of a sighting in 1980 but the private citizen who sent it to us made it clear that he did not wish the report to be publicised. We do not therefore consider that this should be released. We also have a file note of someone reporting orally in May 1975, of a UFO sighting some years previously. Our file note indicates that section 9(2)(a) We do not think it would be helpful or appropriate to make this available.

5. Finally we have a report of a sighting by Wellington Air Traffic Control on 13 March 1977 which was referred to us by Civil Aviation Division. We understand that you have already been in touch with the Ministry of Transport and that they will be making material available to you.

6. We are sending a copy of your letter to the Police Department in case they are able to help you.

7. With respect to paragraph 4 above, we draw your attention to your right by way of complaint under the Official Information Act 1982 to an Ombudsman to seek an investigation and review of a department's refusal to make available specified official informationl

Subject : SPACE DEBRIS

Probable space debris has been discovered in New Zealand close to the site where COSMOS 482 launcher debris landed on 3 April 1972. It would be appreciated if any information could be given concerning its likely origin. No damage was caused but there is considerable public discussion.

2. The debris consists of two spheres which landed some 240 metres apart. The first was discovered on 24 October and the second on 5 November. Both probably landed within a few days of the former date and a witness describes a possible falling object at 1400 on 23 October GMT. (2am local time) The location was 171°44E/42°04S which is 20 km south of Ashburton in the South Island, and one wile from the coast.

3. Only the first object has so far been examined, physical description as follows:

Sphere, weight 882 grams but originally about 10% more. Welded around equator Diameter at equator 180 mm Diameter through poles 165 mm Thickness 3 mm. 18 holes melted through surface including large holes at the poles, one of 20 mm diameter and the other 110 x 20 mm roughly rectangular. Surface spattered with magnetic globules up to 3 mm diameter, probably molten steel. Preliminary analysis 11.1%Si, 0.7%Fe, 0.02%Mg, 0.02%Cu, remainder Al. No identifying marks or attachments. Not radioactive. 4. EIN Comment. At least the first object appeared too early to be part of the Progress-4 Soviet spacecraft. It was too clean inside and out to have been lying unobserved for long. A small impression 3 cm deep possibly caused by impact, was reported in stony ground close to second object. Considering the relatively low melting point of the alloy (about 570°C) it is surprising that complete destruction did not occur. This suggests that the objects were enclosed in a steel structure which protected them from air friction until a late stage in their descent.

ASHBURTON SPACE BALL

1. The object discovered by Mr Section 9(2)(a) on his farm 20 km south of Ashburton on 24 October has been examined and is now at the Chemistry Division, DSIN in Gracefield for analysis.

2. It is unlike the 1972 objects in size, appearance and composition. Constructed of an aluminium-silicon alloy commonly used for castings, the object has been partially melted and spattered with globules of molten steel. It is clean inside and out, showing no sign of the contamination that would be expected if it had lain on the ground unnoticed for a long period. Its country of origin has not been identified so far.

3. Once the full witnesses' reports have been received from the Police, we will attempt to establish whether it is, as we now think possible, one of the many thousands of pieces of "space junk" which orbit the earth and occasionally re-enter the atmosphere.

UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECTS

(Ref. your telephone enquiry of 31 March 1976)

The situation is that several Departments have received reports on UFO sightings and have carried out limited investigations from time to time, but there is no coordinated Government policy on the subject.

2. In April 1908 and again in January 1970 meetings were hold attended by representatives of:

DSIR Carter Observatory Air Traffic Control Operations, Ministry of Transport NZ Meteorological Service ENZAF Directorate of Operations Directorate of Service Intelligence.

3. It was decided that sightings would be recorded on a special form and filed in the Directorate of Service Intelligence.

4. In June 1972 this responsibility was transferred to the Joint Intelligence Bureau (myself) but there have been no further meetings and few reports.

5. The Director EIB has recently dissociated the Durcau from the UFO scene except that I am to be available if required as a "consultant".

6. In effect, there is no coordination between the Departments represented at the meetings each of which may receive and investigate a sighting or consult one another if they think it worthwhile. The Ministry of Defence does not provide any resources for investigating UFO sightings and does not consider them to be a threat. 7. I understand the Chief of Air Staff is at present considering the question of RNZAF policy on UFO sightings and it may therefore be timely to refer the question to him. There might be a chinge from the standard reply that there is "no policy" on the subject.

Thank you for your letter of 23 December 1974 reporting the observation of an unidentified object at 0420 on 22 December.

 We are unable to throw any light on this incident as we do not have the resources to investigate such reports in detail.

3. From the information in your letter (and you did not say how long the object remained in sight) we would agree that it is unlikely to have been a satellite, although the re-entry into the earth's atmosphere of space debris is a possibility. Some thousands of objects are regularly tracked and predictions of their re-entry and burn up in the atmosphere are published by the US National Aeronautical and Space Administration.

On Sunday 22nd December at approx. 0420 when wessel was in a position Motanau Island Bearing 307(T) 10miles an object about the magnitude of Venus was sighted forward of the beam travelling from South to North at a rate that would have covered the 180° of sky in approximately 5 minutes.
