Official Information Act request for information provided to the Prime Minister regarding foreign aid or assistance offered following Cyclone Gabrielle

Thank you for your Official Information Act 1982 (the Act) request of 18 April 2023 relating to foreign assistance or aid offered following Cyclone Gabrielle. Part of your request was transferred to the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet (DPMC) on 28 April 2023 by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade (MFAT). The part transferred to DPMC was:

"For the dates February 12, 2023 to February 21, 2023:

[...]

All official advice provided/relayed to the Prime Minister [...] regarding foreign aid/assistance of any kind."

On 25 May 2025, I wrote to you extending the time limit for response by 23 working days, to 29 June 2023. The additional time was needed because a search through a large quantity of information was needed to identify relevant information, and consultations were needed before a decision could be made on your request. I am now in a position to respond.

As noted in my letter to you of 25 May, there was a briefing provided by the DPMC Policy Advisory Group to the Prime Minister identified as relevant to your request. This briefing was withheld in full.

Please find attached a document consisting of a table of extracts from messages sent on the Signal platform. These are extract messages sent between 12 and 21 February 2023 from the National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA). The messages were sent to a group that included: the Prime Minister, the Minister for Emergency Management, Offices of the Prime Minister, and NEMA officials. This is the only remaining information identified as relevant to your request.

There is a small amount of information which has been withheld under section 6(a) of the Act, to protect the security or defence of New Zealand or the international relations of New Zealand.

You have the right to ask the Ombudsman to investigate and review my decision under section 28(3) of the Act.

This response may be published on DPMC's website during our regular publication cycle. Typically, information is released monthly, or as otherwise determined. Your personal information including name and contact details will be removed for publication.
