## **GOVERNOR-GENERAL'S TRAVEL TO NIUE**

## **Proposal**

Cabinet is asked to note that the Governor-General, Her Excellency The Rt Hon Dame Cindy Kiro, will travel to Niue for Constitution Day celebrations from 19 to 22 October 2024.

# **Purpose of Travel**

- At the invitation of the Prime Minister, the Governor-General undertakes a programme of international travel, representing New Zealand in the Head of State role (Cabinet Manual 2023, paragraph 1.13).
- The Governor-General has a special responsibility for the Realm countries of Niue, the Cook Islands and Tokelau. Each Governor-General pays a visit to the Realm countries during their term of office to reaffirm the relationship between those countries and New Zealand. This is an appropriate time for the Governor-General to visit Niue as it allows her to attend Niue's Constitution Day celebrations on 19 October during the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of self-governance in free association with New Zealand.

#### **Travel**

The Governor-General will be accompanied on the visit by Dr Richard Davies and two Government House staff (the Official Secretary and an Aide-de-Camp) and s6(d) Protection Service officers. The party will travel on commercial flights.

#### **Travel Costs**

- The estimated cost of trip is <sup>\$9(2)(f)(i), \$9(2)(f)(iv)</sup>. This total includes all anticipated costs that will be met from the permanent legislative authority in Vote Prime Minister and Cabinet for the international travel expenses of the Governor-General under section 14 of the Governor-General Act 2010.
- The expenses of the Protection Services officers will be met from Vote Police.

## Consultation

7 The Ministry for Foreign Affairs and Trade has been consulted in the development and implementation of the Governor-General's travel programme. MFAT and Government House are working closely on plans for this visit.

## **Proactive release**

8 This paper will be proactively released, subject to any redactions.

#### **Administrator of the Government**

9 During the absence of the Governor-General from 19 to 22 October 2024, the Chief Justice, Rt Hon Dame Helen Winkelmann, will act as Administrator of the Government.

#### Recommendations

- 10 I recommend that Cabinet:
  - 10.1 **note** that the Governor-General will be absent from New Zealand from 19 to 22 October 2024 to undertake a visit to Niue;
  - 10.2 **note** that the Governor-General will be accompanied by Dr Richard Davies and two Government House staff (the Official Secretary and an Aide-de-Camp) and <sup>s6(d)</sup> Protection Service officers;
  - 10.3 **note** that the total cost of the visit is approximately \*9(2)(f)(i), \*9(2)(f)(iv)
  - 10.4 **note** that these costs will be met from the permanent legislative authority in Vote Prime Minister and Cabinet for the international travel expenses of the Governor-General under section 14 of the Governor-General Act 2010; however, the costs of the s6(d) Protection Services officers will be met from Vote Police;
  - 10.5 **note** that in the absence of the Governor-General from 19 to 22 October 2024 the Chief Justice, Rt Hon Dame Helen Winkelmann, will act as Administrator of the Government.
