Report on Overseas Travel: Rt Hon Christopher Luxon – UAE, January 2025

I recommend Cabinet note this report of my travel to the United Arab Emirates (UAE) from 13 to 15 January 2025. The visit was brought forward and shortened to allow me to attend the funeral of Senior Sergeant Lyn Fleming in Nelson on 15 January.

Report

- 2 During 19 hours on the ground, I was able to deliver on the objectives for the visit, namely:
 - To oversee signature of the UAE-New Zealand Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA) and UAE-New Zealand Bilateral Investment Treaty (BIT). Together with UAE President, His Highness Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, I witnessed the Minister for Trade & Investment and his counterpart sign both the CEPA and BIT. Signing was an important moment, with this the most comprehensive CEPA the UAE has signed (eliminating 98.5 per cent of tariffs upon entry into force) and quickly done (with negotiations having commenced in May 2024).
 - To demonstrate the value New Zealand places on the bilateral relationship with \$6(a) partner in the Gulf by engaging with the UAE President and other leaders. I met with the President of the UAE, five Emirati Ministers, the Crown Prince and other members of the royal family. Those engagements were opportunities to reinforce that New Zealand sees the UAE as \$6(a) partner in the Middle East, with discussions identifying areas to expand our collaboration.
 - To use our presence to leverage New Zealand's trade and economic relations with the Middle East's s6(a) dynamic and internationalised economy, in particular to attract foreign direct investment (FDI) including to New Zealand's renewable energy and infrastructure sectors. With time in the UAE abbreviated, I had time only to hold one business-facing event, which was a meeting with the head of one of the countries' sovereign wealth funds, Abu Dhabi Holding Company (a NZ\$250 billion strategic investment vehicle). s6(a)
- In addition, I was able to use my visit to UAE to boost New Zealand's profile, including a speech at Abu Dhabi Sustainability Week, plus a series of media engagements.
