

## **TARGET DELIVERY ACTIONS**

The Government is focused on restoring law and order, to ensure all New Zealanders feel safe in their communities. The last year has seen a reduction in the number of children and young people with serious and persistent offending behaviour.

## The Government is focused on:

- Strengthening the response to serious and persistent child and youth offenders
  including a second evaluation of the transition to community phase for the Military-Style
  Academy Pilot (June 2025) and awaiting the Second Reading of the Oranga Tamariki
  (Responding to Serious Youth Offending) Amendment Bill, that strengthens the
  Government's response to this small number of young offenders.
- Improving operational responses and youth justice processes to better target those
  who are offending, including establishing Intensive Case Management Teams which are
  operational in Christchurch, Rotorua and Hamilton. The rapid response (Fast Track)
  expansion has been completed across six sites for youth offenders (14 to 17-yearolds). Emerging delivery insights indicate that timely, integrated and coordinated
  Government agency services, supported by community delivery through the Intensive
  Case Management Teams and Fast Track are having a positive impact.
- Preventing offending and reoffending through locally-led initiatives to deliver community-based, cross-agency responses with improved identification of and support for health, mental health, disability and education needs.
- Getting children and youth attending school regularly (see Target 6, Increased Student Attendance).
