I request any information containing legal advice is also included because it is my experience that redacted responses are completely illegible.

As well as ethical obligations, the attorney client privilege does not cover the cooperation and planning and enabling of the violation of laws. I request that if there are redacted statements, I request confirmation that these redacted statements do not discuss any violations of laws, such as the New Zealand Bill of Rights and the Human Rights Act 1990 or any other legislation.

Searches have been completed of our Information Management Systems, and nothing in scope of your request has been identified. Accordingly, your request is refused under section 18(e) of the Act, as the information requested does not exist.
